

CHENOWITH FOREST AND FARM CONSERVANCY

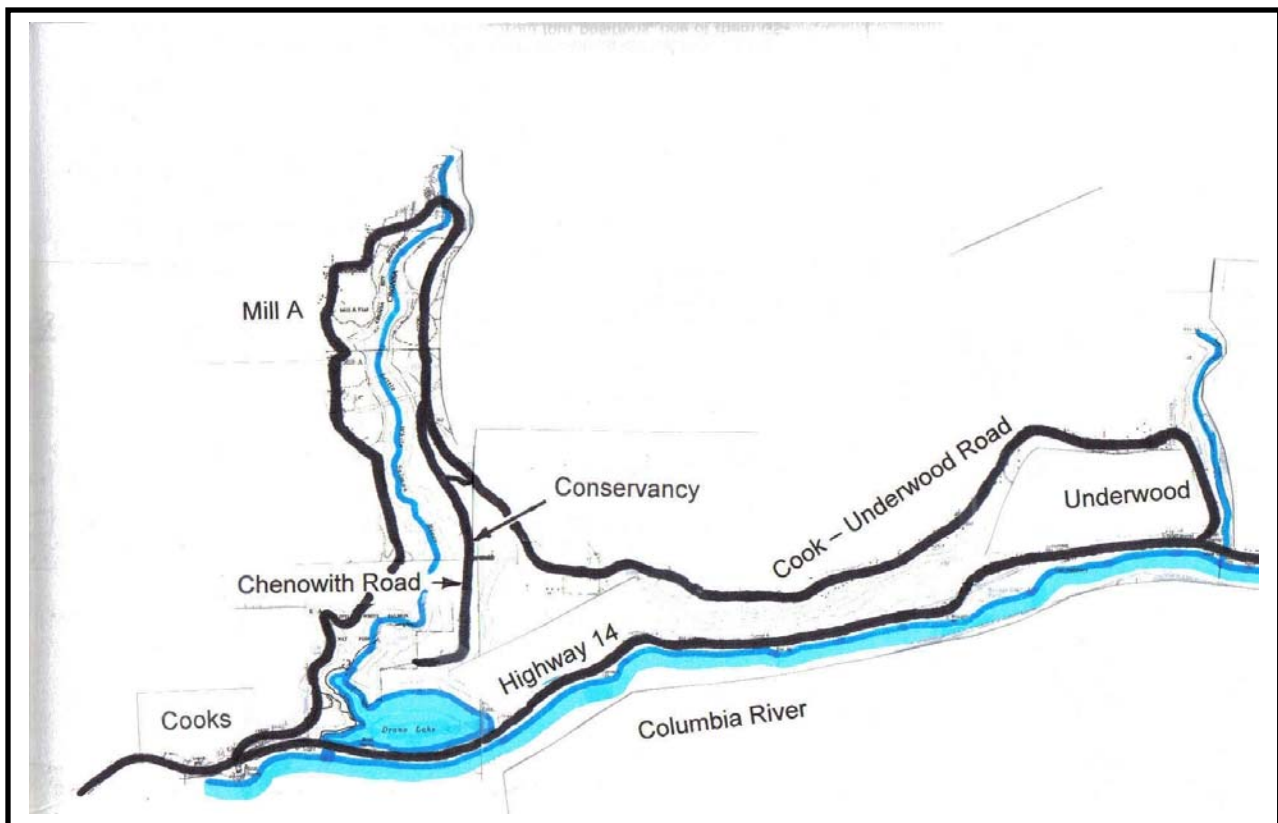
LOCATION:

Chenowith Forest and Farm Conservancy is located near Underwood, WA, approximately 70 miles east of Portland in the Columbia River Gorge.

DIRECTIONS:

From Portland: Travel east on Highway 84 to Cascade Locks. At Cascade Locks, cross the Columbia River on the Bridge of the Gods. Turn east on Washington Highway 14. Proceed to Stevenson. From the east end of Stevenson go 12 miles on Highway 14. Turn north on the Cook/Underwood Road. Proceed 7 miles. Turn right on Chenowith Road for one mile. Stop at the farmhouse on the right for our meeting spot.

From Hood River: Go across the Hood River Bridge. Turn west on Highway 14. Cross the White Salmon River Bridge. Turn north on Cook/Underwood Road. Proceed 7 miles. Turn left on Chenowith Road. Stop at the farmhouse on the right for our meeting place.



SITE DESCRIPTION:

Chenowith Forest and Farm Conservancy was established to provide a unique and significant opportunity to conserve and enhance vital regional biodiversity, provide research and educational opportunities, and support local communities. It consists of 203 acres of forest land and open space located within the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area in Washington. An all volunteer staff is committed to the Conservancy mission. The history of Chenowith began as Cold Spring Farm on Chenowith Road near Underwood, WA in the early 1970's. Over the next 20 years several other adjacent parcels were purchased and consolidated under the Cold Spring Conservancy, a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization. In 2000, the Conservancy in partnership with the Columbia Land Trust, purchased 203 acres with the financial assistance of the Paul Allen Forest Protection Foundation. The name of the Conservancy was changed to Chenowith Forest and Farm Conservancy to clarify its focus and direction.
